The application can be found at www.ELCA.org/domestichungergrants. As you share the link with member organizations in your network, be sure and remind them that the application must be completed and submitted on or before **July 10, 2015**. Organizations approved for funding can expect grant payments in February or March 2016.



Domestic Hunger Grants in action

Domestic Hunger Grants support projects in four categories of ministry: relief, development, organizing and advocacy. In 2015, 324 projects were funded through a total of **\$739,075** in grants. The breakdown of the funding across the project categories is:

- 6 Advocacy Projects
- 58 Development Projects
- 41 Organizing Projects
- 219 Relief Projects

Through these four areas of focus, Domestic Hunger Grants both contribute to meeting immediate needs of families around the country and also look toward long-term growth and development in communities. In the relief sector too, funds allow organizations to expand and improve existing structures and services.

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) the ELCA's disaster and emergency response ministry, has made an initial commitment of \$500,000 to relief and recovery efforts through three of our trusted ecumenical partners: The Lutheran World Federation, Lutheran World Relief and the United Mission to Nepal. Prior to the earthquakes, ELCA World Hunger-supported projects were already active in the region, including an emergency response hub set-up by The Lutheran World Federation. 

ELCA Malaria Campaign passes \$14 million!

Since the close of March, the ELCA Malaria Campaign has surpassed the \$14 million milestone, and we couldn't have done it without you! We have 1 million to go in order to fully fund the malaria programs of our companions and partners and to reach our goal. The ELCA Malaria Campaign has raised **\$14.1 million** so far, which puts us over **94 percent** of the way to reaching our \$15 million goal.
